## A Message from the Principal

Dear Families,
I hope you have all had a great school holiday with your families. It was lovely weather towards the end of the break and a BIG grand final over the weekend. It was lovely to see our whole school celebrate Team Colours Day on the last day of Term 3 and run a whole school parade.

Here we are in October and Term 4 2023! Only 12 weeks of the school year to go. Please set a family goal for your child to attend EVERY DAY this term unless they are unwell. Attendance is very important and if a child even arrives late at school this can impact their whole day and the minutes and hours they miss start to add up.

Please log in to Compass and check how many days your child has been absent this year. Sometimes we forget until we add them up. If your child is missing 25 days a year and continues this pattern over their 7 years of schooling they will miss 35 weeks that is around three and a half terms! Nearly a full year of schooling missed!

Our students also had a special session with our guest author Ben Woods. Ben is a children's book illustrator based in Melbourne, Australia. Ben has illustrated picture books, junior fiction and non-fiction titles. He has worked with top publishers such as Hardie Grant Children's Publishing, Scholastic and Penguin Random House. Ben's work has had notable listings for the Children Book Council Australia, been shortlisted for Readings Children's Book Prize, and shortlisted for the Australian Book Industry Awards in 2019 and 2020.
Best known as the co-creator of the bestselling series REAL PIGEONS by Andrew McDonald, the series is published in 23 languages and sold in 24 territories. A film and TV series is also in development with Nickelodeon and Fulwell 73 Productions.
We also ran our Book Fair at this time which provided families with access to purchase good quality books for their families and raise money for our school at the same time. Thank you to Tracey Nihill for coordinating these events and all her support staff especially Sandra Hosking and Tracey Triffet for their Book Fair organisation.

## Our Connections with Wallan SC
