A Message from the Principal

Dear Families,

We hope you had a great family time over the past long weekend due to our curriculum day and public holiday. The year is speeding by and I hear a lot of families saying we only have 6 weeks to go. That is correct however 6 weeks is still a long time in regards to a child's education. We have 28 days left, which is around 140 hours of learning! Therefore it is not time to switch off as we are close to the end of the year. Instead, set some goals for example:

- I will attend school every day from now until the end of the year.
- I will be at school on time every day.
- I will not leave early in the next 6 weeks.
- I will help to pack my bag for school with snacks, lunch and a water bottle.
- I will have a hat every day.

This is fantastic for Wallan PS as we already have many wonderful supports and programs in place and now we are receiving some funding to extend and add to these areas.

When we look at wellbeing in schools we are looking at the three tiers. Tier 1 - represents the support we have in place for each and every child at the school. Tier 2 - represents the support we have in place for some of our students who need adjustments to support their learning. Tier 3 - represents students that need high-level adjustments and/or specific funding (Previously PSD - Program for Students with Disabilities funding.)

It is the role of our Wellbeing team to work closely with teachers, education support members, external agencies/supports, families and most importantly the students to achieve success at WPS for all students.

Sandra Allison leads our team as the Assistant Principal for Wellbeing and is supported by a very skilled and passionate group, these people include Brenton Allan, Rhys Gibbs, Hayley Sanders and a dedicated team of Education Support Members.

We also connect and work with many external agencies. We have Kaylee, our DE social worker, who supports students in need and we have the HUB 3756 who operates out of our site one day a week. Michelle Preston, one of our Education Support members can help families connect to outside agencies and support teams. Michelle also coordinates for many different companies and services to visit on-site such as glasses for kids, the dentist etc.

So what are some of the supports we have for our Tier 1 students?

- We have Coffee the therapy dog who visits students in their classrooms throughout each term.
- Weekly Social and Emotional lessons in each classroom
- T.E.A.M (Together Everyone Achieves More) program that runs at the start of the year to set expectations
- School Values discussed in every classroom
- Respectful Relationships program
- Zones Emotional Regulation program
- Staff trained in restorative practices
- Clear and concise expectations for students in the classroom and in the yard
- Fortnightly cohort meetings
- Fortnightly Team Building Program Each cohort meets and competes as a class in a team building activity. As a whole cohort, students identify the strengths of others.
- Cyber Safety Lessons for families, teachers and students.
- Patch's Pantry and our Values tickets
- There is much, much more!

Specialist Classes for 2024!

We have completed a review of our specialist classes for 2024 and we have some changes and new specialists to announce for 2024.

- **Explore!** A time for students to 'explore' and develop their skills in various areas such as digital technologies, science, technology, engineering etc. A Specialist program for Yr 5 and 6 in 2024.
- **Bush** Following on from the 'Bush kinder' program in early childhood settings. Incorporating respect for the environment, indigenous elements and science. Move from a trial program in Foundation to Year 1 Semester 2 2023 to a Specialist program for Foundation to Year 2 in 2024.
- **Food** Food was trialled in 2023. The idea was a specialist where students could use the garden and kitchen and create simple recipes that they could replicate at home and share with their families. We have had lots of positive feedback from families and students about this program and we will continue this into 2024.
- **Digi Tech** Digi Tech has been a successful subject over the past few years. We now have increased devices across the school and therefore we can cater for elements of digital tech in the classroom. Therefore we will put this on hold in 2023 for F-4. This will move into the classroom space and be incorporated through inquiry across the school. We will reflect on this move at the end of 2024. Year 5/6 will incorporate elements into the classroom/inquiry and the 'explore' specialist in 2024.
- **Auslan** Due to community feedback in 2022 we moved from Indonesian to Auslan in 2023. The feedback has been very positive, especially in our junior end of the school. Therefore we will continue to develop this specialist in 2024. Yr 5/6 will just be a short 10 15 min session incorporated into their 'Explore' specialist and the specialist teacher will supply classroom teachers with resources to follow up with Auslan in the classroom each week.



PARENT PAYMENT FOR 2024.

Dear Families,

In 2024 we are continuing to further develop our Wallan PS community ensuring we are a space to support all our students to learn, grow and achieve with various opportunities. With the support of the school council and listening to community feedback, we have begun to develop our digital technology resources and practices further.

We are now in a structure where all students in years 3-6 will have an allocated device one-to-one. All students in foundation to year 2 will have a one-to-two model. Families do not need to supply these devices. All devices are supplied by the school and stay onsite. To support the continued implementation and integration of these devices, we are also investing in various programs to supply student learning, such as Mathletics, for further development in maths. We also introduced the Seesaw platform for students and teachers to share their learning with families through videos and photos, and parents can also communicate with the teacher. In 2024 we will continue our partnership with The Cyber Safe Project and run more cyber-safe sessions at school for our students and offer a session of an evening to support our families.

Over the years, Wallan PS has moved to a model where families do not need to provide a voluntary contribution. The school is covering each student for:

Start of Year Book Pack - includes pens, pencils, textas, workbooks, paper, photocopying, glue etc.

Preps (Foundation) receive their book satchel.

Excursions are capped at a maximum of \$35 per child with the school covering any costs above this.

Many incursions have been paid for by the school or a portion of the cost to support families.

In 2024 we will continue to supply the above to our students and to support the improvements around technology, we are asking for a voluntary contribution of **\$50 per student** to support our school in moving towards achieving our goal with technology. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil standard Victorian Curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

You can make this payment by logging into Compass and going to 'Course Confirmation and Payments.' Some families have requested to donate more. If you choose to, you can provide an additional donation through the school office.

Volunteers and fundraising events also assist our school and the programs we can offer. We sincerely thank our school community for all their contributions.
