- Modelling calm and respectful behaviour to ensure a safe and positive environment.

We also remind families that if concerns arise involving other children, these must be directed to the school, not to the child involved. By working together, we can keep every member of our community safe and supported.




MORE FUN IN FOUNDATION... Milo's Birthday Party!
