Water Safety Tips for Families This Summer

As we head into the warmer months, many families will be spending time at pools, beaches, rivers and water parks. Please keep your children safe with these simple water safety reminders:

- 1. Always supervise children around water
 - Active, constant adult supervision is essential.
 - Keep young children within arm's reach at all times.
 Avoid distractions such as phones or long conversations.
- 2. Teach children to swim and practise water confidence
 - Swimming lessons help build skills and safety awareness.



- Encourage children to float, kick, and practise safe entry and exit.
- 3. Use life jackets when needed
 - Life jackets are strongly recommended for boating, fishing, or river swimming. Choose the correct size and ensure it is properly fastened.
- 4. Know the water conditions
 - Beaches: swim between the flags and follow lifeguard instructions.
 Rivers and lakes: check depth, currents, and submerged objects.
 Pools: ensure fences and gates are secure.
- 5. Set clear rules with your child
 - No running near water.
 - No diving into shallow water.
 - Always swim with an adult.
 - Stay within the designated swimming area.
- 6. Be sun smart while swimming
 - Apply sunscreen 20 minutes before swimming and reapply every two hours.
 - Wear a rash vest, hat, and stay hydrated.
- 7. Learn basic first aid and CPR
 - Knowing how to respond quickly in an emergency can save a life.
- 8. Model safe behaviour
 - Children copy adults—show them what safe water behaviour looks like.

eScooter and eBikes

Some important information for families, especially after the sad loss of life of a young man on an e-bike recently. Families, please look at the quidelines shared with us from the Victoria Police around restrictions for children on escooters, ebikes and general bikes. Please consider this when purchasing Christmas presents. All students must have a helmet when riding a bike or scooter to school. In 2026, we will not be storing e-scooters or e-bikes on our school site. Please ensure that if you allow your child to ride this to school, you are there to take it home with you. Scooters, bikes and skateboards will be able to be stored in our bike shed. Please see links below:

FOF - Festival Of Fun!


