Learning, Leading and Looking Ahead

Our teachers and leaders have been very busy over the past few weeks engaging in a range of professional learning and future planning.

As part of our Professional Learning Communities (PLCs), staff have been focusing on the Zones of Regulation to support students in understanding and managing their emotions effectively.

We've also been looking ahead to 2026, reviewing a variety of school datasets — including the Staff Opinion Survey, Parent Opinion Survey, and Student Attitudes to School Survey — alongside our teaching and learning data. This helps us assess how we're tracking against our current Annual Implementation Plan and our four-year School Strategic Plan, and set directions for the year ahead.

Staff have also been participating in our Real Schools professional learning, where we're moving into the next focus area of Mindset and Culture. Members of our leadership team have been involved in additional Real Schools network sessions, connecting with other schools to share ideas and best practices.

While the new Department guidelines around device time will begin in 2027, we are already mindful of ensuring a healthy balance of screen time within our teaching and learning programs. We also continue to support families by sharing cyber safety tips and updates via Compass throughout the year.

Teaching Excellence Program 2025

Our school values the learning and development of our staff, and the positive impact this has on student outcomes and school improvement.

We are proud to share that Tim Azaris and Rachael Noble have continued their professional learning journey through the <u>Teaching Excellence Program</u> at the Victorian Academy of Teaching and Leadership.

This program enables teachers to advance their capabilities and excellence in teaching. So far this year, Tim and Rachael have participated in 3 discipline days and 3 Teaching Excellence Community Learning days. They have also completed a teacher inquiry project where they focused on a particular teaching practice to improve the outcomes for students in their class. Currently, they are completing another inquiry to strengthen their teaching practice even further.

Art has always been my healing & I have loved sharing my story & the story of others through art. In the past, Victorian Aboriginal art styles have been under represented, and finding these styles printed on garments or other products has been very difficult. Over the years, my family and friends have always expressed how much they'd love to wear my designs, and with their encouragement & support, More Than Lines was born.
