#### Real Schools Visit – Building Stronger Relationships

We were pleased to welcome back Daniel, our Real Schools educator, who spent time working in classrooms across the school. Daniel modelled strategies that support our focus on affective interactions and the power of the language we use when engaging with students. His visit reinforced the importance of restorative conversations in our school—recognising that as an educational system, our goal is always to teach and support growth. At the same time, we acknowledge there is still an important place for logical consequences when needed.



Daniel has been working with us for over 18 months, and we're now approaching the halfway point of our three-year partnership with Real Schools. The impact of this work is already being seen, not only in improved student interactions but in the way our whole school community approaches behaviour and relationships.

He was incredibly impressed by the respectful and positive behaviour demonstrated across all year levels, and made particular mention of the maturity and leadership shown by our Year 5 and 6 students. This feedback is a credit to our students, staff, and families who continue to embrace the principles of restorative practice.

We look forward to continuing this important work as we build a culture of respect, responsibility, and genuine connection.

#### Supporting Student Well-being: Introducing MHIPS

At Wallan Primary we are committed to supporting the wellbeing of our students both academically and emotionally. We are excited to discuss the work we have been doing with the Mental Health in Primary Schools (MHIPS) initiative. This is a program designed to provide additional support for students' mental health and well-being within our school community. This is run by our Mental Health and Wellbeing Lead, Miss Rachael Noble and Assistant Principal Mrs Melanie Gibson, who both have a strong passion for student wellbeing.

MHIPS focuses on early intervention, equipping educators with the tools to recognize and support students experiencing emotional challenges. We have a lot of current programs supporting mental health at Wallan Primary, including Coffee the support dog, School Wide Positive Behaviours, Respectful Relationships, The Hub, our school social worker, First Nations projects, Team building, warm welcome, Real Schools and student directed lunchtime clubs. In Term 2, we will be introducing a new project called 'Dash', which is a fun and interactive 9-week program for some year 5/6 students. It aims to deepen community connections and belonging for young people.

Stay tuned for more information on how MHIPS will be integrated into our school throughout the year.

#### Teaching Excellence Program 2025

Our school values the learning and development of our staff, and the positive impact this has on student outcomes and school improvement.

We are proud to share that Tim Azaris and Rachael Noble have begun their professional learning journey through the <u>Teaching Excellence Program</u> at the Victorian Academy of Teaching and Leadership.

This program enables teachers to advance their capabilities and excellence in teaching. Through the program, Tim and Rachael will grow their knowledge of teaching practice by participating in 10 in person days of professional learning and inquiring deeply into 2 areas of their practice, using the evidence-informed practice, generative AI, First Nations' perspectives, student engagement tools and discipline-specific learning. They will also be inspired by national and international experts in the field of education through 2 dedicated conferences.

We look forward to working with Tim and Rachael to implement their knowledge and skills from the program to continue to support student outcomes and wellbeing at our school. We are proud that we have Tim and Rachael, as well as Lauren L and Adam (2024) representing our school and supporting the Academy in raising the status of this amazing profession!

We have had many questions about what this looks like. More information will begin to be available in the coming terms. However, what we can clarify at this stage is:

- If you live in the Wallan East zone and currently attend Wallan PS you do not have to move to Wallan East you can choose to stay at Wallan PS for the remainder of your schooling.
- If you have a Foundation student starting in 2026 and you live in the Wallan East PS zone and you have a sibling enrolled in Wallan PS in 2026 you can enrol your Foundation student at Wallan PS if you choose.
- If you live in the Wallan East zone and are planning to complete an enrolment application (when they are available) please let us know as this will impact our 2026 planning.
- If you want to attend Wallan PS in 2026 and do not live in our zone you can complete the enrolment application and we will work through the Department process to see if you can be accepted in line with the Department timeline.
