## IMPORTANT REMINDERS



#### **Attendance**

Students are expected to be at school every day unless they are sick. Parents are asked to record absences via the Compass Parent Portal, email the school email account, call the office or provide a note explaining the reason for the absence.

#### **Uniform**

Uniform must be worn in full every day.

Students not in uniform may be asked to change at the office in the morning. Please refer to the Uniform Policy on our website.

Families may choose to purchase generic uniforms from department stores like Kmart, best & less & Target.

#### **Late Arrivals**

School gates open at 8:30am and classrooms are open at 8.45am. Students are expected to be at school on time, every day, to ensure they do not miss the beginning of the learning focus.

If your child is late to school, a parent/guardian must walk them to the office and sign them in.

#### Water bottles

Students are required to bring their own water bottle and water can be consumed at any time during the day. Food and non water drinks can only be consumed at designated eating times.

#### **Sun Smart**

Wide brimmed, legionaries or bucket hats must be worn from 15th August to 30th April. Generic hats can be worn as long as they are a sun smart style – no caps. Students without hats must stay under shaded areas. Staff are expected to model sun smart behaviours at all times. Sun cream is encouraged but must be applied by students independently.

Healthy snacks can be consumed in the classroom at a suitable time, decided upon by the teacher.

Grade 1 students will be learning the rules and skills for a range of Athletics Day events, including the sack race, egg and spoon race, tug of war, and hula hoop relay. They'll be developing their teamwork, coordination, and sportsmanship as they get ready for the big day!







Welcome to the final term for the year! In Bush we will be learning about flowers, why we have them, why we need them, and their parts. The children will construct their own flowers to add to a combined "Spring" wall display. What would spring be without insects? We will be adding a variety of bugs to our garden as well.

We will be joining the Great Aussie Bird count again this year, with all grades heading out with binoculars and checklists, just like real scientists. The results will be recorded on the national website, providing lots of data for our scientists about what birds live in each area.



VISUAL ACTS



In Term 4, the Year 1 students will be learning about famous artist Yayoi Kusama, known for her bright colours and dot-covered artworks. Inspired by her playful style, students will explore repetition, line, shape, and colour to create fun 2D and 3D artworks. They will experiment with a range of materials and techniques to decorate their own objects and celebrate creativity through pattern and play.



In Performing Arts & Auslan during Term 4, students will be learning the lyrics and signs to *Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer*. The students will then perform this song at a Christmas Concert at the end of the year. Towards the second half of term the students will play drama games and perform mini acts on the stage.

#### This term in.....



In English this term, we'll keep building vocabulary and speaking skills to support reading and writing. Students will focus on understanding what they read, building clear sentences, and using punctuation like full stops and capital letters. We're excited to see their confidence grow as readers and writers!



Our Little Learners Love Literacy program focuses on teaching children the 44 sounds of the English language and the principles of the alphabetic code (that each speech sound can be represented by different groups of letters) in seven carefully sequenced stages. We start with teaching the simple code, focusing on phonics and phonemic awareness to build the strongest foundations for reading and spelling success.



In Numeracy this term, we'll continue working on place value and skip counting. We'll revise addition and subtraction strategies that we've learnt. Students will learn more about interpreting data and how we can display this. We'll also be focusing on location and giving and receiving directions.



In Inquiry this term, we'll be learning about nature. Students will investigate mini beasts, what living things need to grow, and the different seasons. It's going to be a another fun term full of exploring, making, and discovering!
