Attendance

Students are expected to be at school every day unless they are sick. Parents are asked to record absences via the Compass Parent Portal, email the school email account, call the office or provide a note explaining the reason for the absence.



Uniform must be worn in full every day.

Late Arrivals

School gates open at 8:30am and classrooms are open at 8.45am. Students are expected to be at school on time, every day, to ensure they do not miss the beginning of the learning focus.

If your child is late to school, a parent/guardian must walk them to the office and sign them in.



Water Bottles

Students are required to bring their own water bottle and water can be consumed at any time during the day. Food and non water drinks can only be consumed at designated eating times.

Sun Smart

Wide brimmed, legionaries or bucket hats must be worn from 15th August to 30th April. Generic hats can be worn as long as they are a sun smart style – no caps. Students without hats must stay under shaded areas.

Staff are expected to model sun smart behaviours at all times. Sun cream is encouraged but must be applied by students independently.

Specialist programs

physical Education



This term in PE, students will consolidate their skills in preparation for the House Athletics Carnival on 6 November 2025. They will also be introduced to Gaelic Football, a traditional Irish sport that combines elements of soccer, rugby and basketball. Students will learn the key skills of bouncing, soloing, kicking, passing and scoring, while also developing teamwork, strategy and sportsmanship through modified games.



food



This term in Food, students will be making different cultural foods.

Throughout the year they have looked at different recipes and suggested things for us to cook. They will be cooking recipes including 'Butter chicken' and 'Shortbread'.



visual arts



This term in Visual Arts, students will be completing their legacy fence posts. These will then be used to create a fence around the school. They will get to design and paint their own terracotta plant pot which they will get to take home.

This term in.....



In Literacy this term, we have implemented a new literacy program called Ochre. Students are strengthening their speaking, listening, reading, and writing skills through a range of engaging activities and texts. They are learning to use vivid and purposeful language, adjust their tone and formality for different audiences, and apply strategies such as paraphrasing and questioning. They are also exploring how bias and language choices can shape meaning. Students are engaging with a variety of text types to build literal and inferred understandings, focusing on how language features, imagery, and structure create meaning and perspective. Our class novel, Once by Morris Gleitzman, is a central focus as we explore characters, themes, and historical context. Students are experimenting with vocabulary, literary devices, and text structures to create cohesive and engaging pieces for specific purposes and audiences. They are also editing and refining their work, applying punctuation and grammar to enhance clarity and effect.

Numeracy

This term in Numeracy, students are developing their understanding of fractions, decimals, and percentages by solving real-world problems and using estimation to find approximate solutions. They are applying mathematical modelling to explore financial and practical situations, justifying their reasoning and problem-solving choices. Students are also deepening their understanding of data and chance by comparing different types of data sets, using digital tools to conduct simulations, and analysing the relationship between expected and observed outcomes. Additionally, they are using the Cartesian plane to locate and represent integers, exploring area and angle relationships to solve problems, and creating tessellating patterns through combinations of transformations.

Inquiry

In Inquiry this term, students are learning about animal adaptations and how these features help animals survive in their environments. They are exploring how environmental changes and human impacts can threaten animal survival and contribute to endangerment. Acting as wildlife warriors, students will consider sustainable actions that can support the protection and survival of different species. They will also learn about the significance of animals to First Nations Australian peoples and explore how practices such as cultural burning can help sustain habitats and wildlife. To conclude the unit, students will research an endangered animal and present their findings at a Conservation Conference to raise awareness about its survival needs.
